We extend our sympathy to the families of two who contributed much to tennis over the years. Bob Arndt and Jim Schneider, who recently passed on, were longtime supporters and volunteers of the Inner City Tennis program. I met Jim and his young grandson Michael Lunka approximately 10 years ago while volunteering for the Saturday InnerCity Tennis program at Reed-Sweat. It was satisfying for me as a volunteer and Jim as a grandfather to see Michael progress through the various ICT programs and eventually reach the State High School Doubles Tennis Tournament at least three times as a high school player at Henry Sibley High School. Bob was a member of the STPC for over 15 years and has been recognized for organizing the successful "Match Singles" Group that continues to offer playing opportunities.

Davis Cup

Serbia defeated the USA 3-2 in the first round of play in early March. It was the first time Serbia advanced to the second round and it was also the first time the USA was eliminated in the first round. The USA Team played without Andy Roddick and James Blake for the first time since 2000. The two USA points were achieved by Sam Querrey in a singles victory over Viktor Troicki and a doubles win by John Isner and Bob Bryan over Nenad Zimonjic and Janko Tipsarvic. Mike Bryan, the other half of the #1-ranked Bryan brothers, was not able to compete due to illness. The Serbia team also included #2-ranked Novak Djokovic.

Delay of game?By David Chatfield

If you read Tennis magazine's "Court of Appeals" this month don't let "Delay of Game" mislead you. The case was that the doubles partners were at the net when the opponents blistered a shot past them to the back line. The partners couldn't make the call so they moved to the observed spot and then called the shot out. They were playing on clay. The opponents complained about length of time of call. The Court of Appeals said the partners were right in taking a second look. The Code, item 22 says "the player should take a careful second look at any point-ending placement that is close to a line on a clay court." (synopsis).

However, on *hard* courts like most of us play on, **The Code**, item 18 says "a player should make all calls promptly after the ball has hit the

court. A call shall be made either before the players return shot has gone out of play or before the opponent has had the opportunity to play the return shot." (synopsis).

So this is the code item to follow on hard court surfaces.

Some of us have a bad habit of catching a ball we "know" is going out. **Don't do it!** The rules are clear—if you do that, the point belongs to your opponent. The best way to correct this problem? If opponent catches ball, claim the point—he/she won't do it again! If **you** offend, give point to opponent.

However, in this case we (graciously?) conceded the point since clearly it was mere accident that the ball hit opponent's foot.

Where did my \$25 go???

With about 1400 dues-paying members in the Senior Tennis Players Club (STPC), we sometimes hear the question "What does STPC do with the \$25 annual membership fee it receives from each of its members?" After reviewing the treasurer's books for 2009 (and a little arithmetic), here's what it boils down to.

\$10.29 of the \$25 went into publishing the newsletter, 10 issues per year. This includes salary of the editor (which also includes maintaining our website www.seniortennismn.com), printing, and postage. The newsletter and website not only give you club news, but also schedules, information on club events, and other related information.

\$9.60 of the \$25 paid for our pro instructors to give free lessons and drills to our members. The lessons are free all year round, but during the winter months (September through April), people taking the lessons pay court costs (\$5 in 2009) for use of the indoor courts.

\$3.70 of the \$25 was used for membership expenses, including postage and printing of forms for renewals and new members, as well as printing and postage of rosters which list all of our members.

\$3.21 of the \$25 was used for contributions to tennisrelated charities. These included **Inner City Tennis**, **Fred Wells Tennis and Education Center**, and **St.**

Paul Urban Tennis.

\$1.48 of the \$25 went into expenses for the Annual Meeting and Captains Luncheon. STPC provides a free meal to each of the captains who are so important to making STPC function properly, providing members with physical and mental exercise, social benefits, and fun.

\$1.27 of the \$25 went into administrative expense, which includes office supplies, postage, website, insurance, and other miscellaneous expenses.

The tournaments (Jack Dow and Grandparent-Grandchild), the Boyer-Hughes Clinic, and the tennis parties (including the summer picnic) are planned on a breakeven basis (expenses equal income) and they generally come out close to that. In reality, this year, for a change, we actually came out ahead about 46 cents per member.

When we add up all of these expenses, we should end up with \$25. Right? **Whoops!!** We have \$29.09. How can that be? We actually have some other income besides the \$25 dues, including some interest from Certificates of Deposits (CDs) and money market accounts, plus some miscellaneous income, including donations and T-shirt sales. Over all, we had a small loss for the year, the second year in a row.

I hope this has given you more answers than questions. I will also discuss it at our Annual Meeting and Captains Luncheon in Spring, but if you have questions relating to this, you can call me at 952-975-1895.
