

About your picture in the April Senior Tennis Times—it was nostalgic. I went to the matches at Indian Wells three times and sure loved it.



- 2. An STPC pro will email you with an outdoor court location and time he is available. Confirm with him.

Several of you mentioned there will be no summer

lessons on the north side. But now Tim Jachymowski, the owner of Public Indoor Tennis, is offering a class for seniors on Tuesday afternoons indoors from 1:00-2:30 for \$7.00 beginning May 1. I'll teach. See our summer lesson schedule on page 4. This is a drop-in clinic, and we have access to all 4 courts. Just think: no rain-outs, no playing in the hot sun, 1½ hours of indoor tennis for \$7.00. *Thanks Tim!*

Our summer program will feature work on volleys, serves, return of serves, and ground strokes.

The city is installing new meters. A convenience: they take credit cards. **Some surprises:** In some areas, rates are not constant. For example, 5th St SE behind Baseline where the rate is \$1.25/hour Monday-Friday 8 AM to 5 PM. But Monday-Friday after 5 PM and weekends all day it is \$2.50/hour! Caution: be sure you enter your space

number correctly. With the keypad, it is easy to touch a number adjacent to the one you want. Press Cancel and start over if you accidentally enter the wrong number. And save your receipt, in case you get a ticket. We've had instances where the police ticketed a car while the driver was using the pay station! You can get a map showing rates at

Sony Erickson Open

The Sony Ericsson Open set another attendance record with over 326,000 fans during the two week tournament. Fans enjoyed some of the biggest names in tennis and great weather in late March in Key Biscayne, Florida. In the men's singles championship, Novak Djokovic, Serbia, defeated Andy Murray, Great Britian, 6-1, 7-6(4). Djokovic improved his record to 90-8 since January, 2011. He has won 5 Grand Slam titles, including the last three in a row. Murray reached the final after Rafael Nadal withdrew because of a knee injury. In women's singles, Agnieszka Radwanska, Poland, defeated Maria Sharapova, Russia, 7-5, 6-4 in the championship match. Leander Paes, India/Radek Stepanek, Czech Repubic, defeated Max Mirnyi, Belarus/Daniel Nestor, Canada, 3-6, 6-1, 10-8 in men's doubles. Paes/Stepanek defeated the #1 ranked Bryan twins from the USA in the quarter-finals 6-4, 6-4. Eric Butorac, Rochester, and partner B. Soares, Brazil, lost a close first round match to finalists Mirnyi/Nestor 6-3, 7-6(4). In women's doubles, Maria Kirilenko, Russia/Nadia Petrova, Russia, defeated Sara Errani, Italy/Roberta Vinci, Italy, 7-6(0), 4-6, 10-4.

Boy's high school

Dusty Boyer of Forest Lake is expected to win his fourth consecutive state singles championship. He won his first title as a freshman in 2009 and has lost only one high school match since then to **Wyatt McCoy** of Mounds View during the 2011 regular season. Four titles would be a state record for Boyer. Only two players, both from Rochester, have won three in a row: **Dave Healy** 1953-55 and **Chuck Darley** 1962-64. **Jim**

Paulsen of the Star Tribune reported on April 6 that Blake and Breck will again be among the best teams in both classes in the state. Other top teams to watch include Eden Prairie, Forest Lake, Mounds View and Wayzata. Put a high school tennis match on your spring schedule.

The Gopher Women, coached by **Tyler Thomson**, dropped a tough match to Purdue on April 15. Purdue won the doubles point and the first three singles points before the Gophers won the final three singles matches in a 4-3 loss to the #34 ranked team.
