TENNIS TIPS

Now that it's winter, here's a suggestion: Don't use hand lotion before playing as it clogs the pores of the leather grips of your racket and can cause them to become slippery in time.

"Everyone wants to play someone better." However, try playing with someone not as good as you are. There are many things you can try that you probably wouldn't with your own caliber of player or better:

- 1. Get only one serve; they get two.
- Should you serve two, try two firm top-spin serves instead of one hard and one soft; also go for placement.
- Practice using drop shots, halfvolleys, top-spin lobs, forehand and backhand.

- 4. Use a slice return of serve.
- Hit gently to the opponent of lesser ability so they can return it.
- Give them a one-point lead. Example: Start the game at 15-love or love-15 (depending on who is serving).
- "Placement Practice." Hit as close to the lines as you can.
- See how low and deep over the net you can hit your approach shots.
- You can hit ground strokes and lobs, but no volleys. They can hit any strokes.

Who knows? Some day the opponent of lesser ability may take lessons, practice and/or play a lot, and some day you may be the one of lesser ability. It does happen!

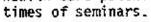
