The schedule indicates play will start June 1. You can play, however, during May from 10 a.m. to 12 noon Mondays through Fridays.




#### TO ALL MEMBERS:

TENNIS TIPS By Percy Hughes

- When calling scores, never say "30deuce." A score isn't "deuce" until it's "40-40." Then we say "deuce."
- Outdoor play is starting. When playing on a sunny day, please use a hat, cap or visor. Also, have a jug of water or a vitamin C drink with you. Drink a little ever so often.

HELPFUL HINT By Nick Pappas

If you wear bifocals, trifocals or progressive lenses while playing tennis, you're performing a disservice to yourself. Get out your old distance glasses without the bifocal, etc. and see what a difference it makes. One doesn't need several images of a tennis ball when it's coming at you.

The bottom line is that you need distance glasses--playing without bifocals or trifocals is better than playing with them.
