Go Forward as You Hit the Ball

Many players back up when a ball is hit right at them. Try to sidestep and then move forward. It's much easier to take one step sideways rather than two or three steps backward. It's also better to hit a half-volley going forward than a ground stroke while you're back-pedaling.
