

How to Retrieve a Deep Lob Safely


DON'T BACKPEDAL FACING A NET! We have had many sprains and fractures from this method of moving to a ball hit over our heads.

Like an outfielder chasing down a deep flyball turn your body and feet toward the back fence, watch the ball over your

shoulder and move quickly. By turning tail this way, you'll safely cover more ground. Your upper body will already be turned sideways and your racquet will be back, ready to swing at the ball after the bounce. You'll make a better return and, more importantly, there's less chance of the feet becoming tangled.

BODY CONDITIONING BEFORE YOU PLAY

It's most important to get the entire body warm before you start your game. Here are some stretching exercises that will eliminate the potential


