Put the date on your calendar right now!






HAPPY BIRTHDAY, PERCY

TENNIS TIPS By Virginia Morgan

Check your public library for tennis instruction films. The Northwestern Tennis Association also rents tennis films (for a fee). Call 546-0703.

When attending a tennis match, the best seats are not the "50-yard line" as you watch like a windshield wiper from there.

Try to be on time when you're going to play. Do your stretching exercises before you go on the court.

Never walk behind another court during their play. Wait until their point ends and then walk fast, single file, and without any conversation.

Never serve until the opponent is ready to receive.

Never touch the net with racquet or body until point has ended.

When hitting a ball, never aim for the line. Aim about 10 inches in for a lesser chance of error.

It rarely happens, but should a ball be hit to your court and have so much spin on it that it returns back over the net to your opponent's court (before it has bounced in your court), you can then reach over the net (but not touch it) to get a racquet on the ball so that you don't lose the point.

If a ball is going out, you should not catch it whether you are inside or outside the court until it has bounced out of bounds or bounced twice in the court.

When serving, always hold two balls or put one in a pocket.

Communicate with your partner; e. g., "yours," "mine," "help," "watch," "I have it." Never call a ball "good" - the main calls are when a ball is out, fault, double fault and let.

Never return a ball to the server unless you have her/his attention and then return them one at a time. If two players are returning balls, the person furthest away returns first.

Should you not remember the score, go back to the last score you can remember.

If a server serves out of turn, as soon as it is discovered change to correct server and keep all points played. If receiver is on the wrong side of the court, receiver stays until the game is over and then goes to the correct side.

Don't forget to call the score loud and clear. If it's noisy, use hand signals.

If you are ready to serve and one of the players wants to send you a ball, hold up the two balls and say "I have two." Should you have only one ball, hold it up and say "need one."

Never return a ball to another court during their playing of a point. Wait until the point ends or gently roll it to the back of the court. If your ball goes to another court and it is not where they would step on it, don't ask for your ball until their point is over.

Know where all three balls are at all times. Gently hit balls to the server - don't push them on the ground with the racquet. It's best to keep all three balls on the same side of the server - the game runs smoother.

UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL

This month Up Close and Personal focuses on Franz Ucko, a man who has had a more interesting life than most.

A German Jew, Franz fled the Nazis and ended up in Manila in 1941. While there, he worked for the U. S. Army as a photographer. In the course of his work he traveled to some of the remotest parts of the Philippines. He was one of the first westerners to meet the Agta Negritos, a primitive forest-dwelling people. He recorded his meeting with dozens of photographs.

Time passed, and the war ended. Franz met his wife on Guam where she was stationed as a WAAC. They married in 1948. They moved to Saint Paul, where they raised a son and daughter.

Franz went to work at Buckbee Meers as a mechanical engineer. After ten years with Buckbee, he went to Motorola to work on microlithography, and then in 965 went to work for Control Data. During his twenty years with CDC, Franz did R & D on solid state electronics, microcircuits, and integrated circuits. He is the owner of three patents and has published twelve scientific papers. Although retired, he still works part-time as a consultant.

In 1986, Franz read an article in Natural History about the Agta Negritos. Recalling the photographs he took in 1945, he contacted the author of the article. The author, an archaeologist, and her husband, an anthropologist, had lived with Agta and were writing a book about them. They met and compared stories and photographs. The relationship developed to the point where Franz and the couple, Agnes and Bion Griffin, planned a nine-day trip into the remote Sierra Madre region of Luzon to see if they could find the same people Franz photographed in 1945.

Unfortunately, they didn't find any of ranz's subjects - they speculate those reople lived further into virtually

impassable territory 25 miles from where the 1987 trip took them. They did, however, during their unbelievably arduous journey locate two related clans and photographed them. For Franz, it was an unforgettable experience.

Franz is a volunteer interpreter at the Science Museum of Minnesota on the anthropology floor (of course!), especially in contemporary Maya. He also teaches functional illiterates with the aid of computers at the Saint Paul Technology for Literacy Center. For many years he has been an elder and choir member of the North Como Presbyterian Church.

Back in the more mundane world of Saint Paul, Franz saw Jack Dow being interviewed on TV about senior tennis. Intrigued, he joined STPC and started taking lessons at Nicollet from Percy Hughes. Before this, the last time Franz had picked up a racquet was in Manila in 1941.
