A beautiful tennis bag from Roger Boyer, Prince Manufacturing Company. Many thanks, Roger.



There are rules we need to live by when playing on our reserved tennis courts in the summer season.

If you come early and start playing before our scheduled time, you will still
rotate on the regular schedule--making a
change every 40 minutes, beginning with
the starting time which has been scheduled
for that court.

You may want to play with certain people and continue to do so even when others rotate. This is not possible at our scheduled places of play. Everyone must rotate according to the captain's direction. It is suggested that you and the others you wish to keep playing with remove yourselves to another facility.

Most often there is one nearby. Captains have this information.

When there are people waiting to play, the ones who were there the longest ought to give up their courts first. This can be done at any time, even in the middle of a 40-minute playing period.

We hope that everyone will wear appropriate tennis clothes. Men, shirts are required on all public courts.

Observe United States Tennis Association rules.

Cooperate with the captain.
