Three seniors teams are advancing to the sectional championship:

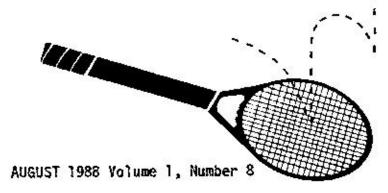

TENNIS TIPS

After opening a new can of balls, use a permanent marking pen to print your initial or initials (or other mark) on all three balls.

When opening a new can of balls, note the instructions on the top of the can. Pull the tab straight up to relieve the air pressure, turn the can around, put your thumb in the center of the lid and peel back and up. The lid is very sharp; please be careful. If your leather grip needs replacing, the alternative to a new leather grip is a synthetic overwrap that comes in different colors. If you don't want to enlarge your grip, get the overwrap that says "super thin." There are three in a package for about \$4.50 at Kokesh, Pro Shops, K-Mart, Target, Best, etc.

Be sure to call the score loud and clear before you serve. During play use hand signals, too, if a ball is out as sometimes surrounding noises interfere with hearing a call.
