

## Some Joubles Tactics and Strategy

The basic principles underlying successful doubles play arm:

- Keep the ball in play.
- P. Play together as a team.
- 3. Attack!

Doubles should be played at the net, but if your volley is suspect and you're more confident with your back-court game, stay at the baseline during matches while you work on your volley in practice.

Please practice the volley! Gradually you will develop the skill and confidence to take the net. A team that plays parallel is stronger than a team that plays up and back. If your partner goes to the net, you should, too, and if your partner retreats to cover a lob, so should you. Up together, back together.
