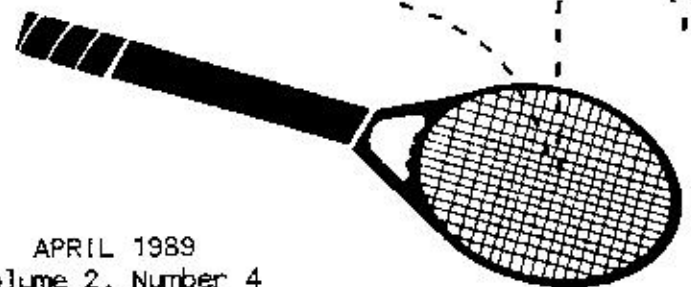

UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL

Joseph S. Stoutenburgh, our newly elected President, retired in 1985 from Sperry Univac. He was Vice President of Systems Engineering for the Defense Systems Division.

Joe received his BS degree from the United States Naval Academy in 1945 and his BSEE (Electronics) from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1948.

Besides serving at sea, Joe held several positions in the Navy. He served six years as project officer in the Bureau of Ships for the design, development and fleet introduction of the Naval Tactical Data System for which he was awarded the Legion of Merit, the highest peacetime award given. This system continues to serve the fleet in 1989.

Joe joined Sperry Univac in 1964 as a Staff Engineer, left in 1968 to become President and Chairman of the Board of Atron Corporation, then rejoined Sperry Univac in 1974 and served in director-level positions within the Defense Systems organization prior to his appointment as Vice President, Systems Engineering in 1982.

Joe picked up on tennis six years ago although his playing goes back to earlier years--he was on the tennis team at M.I.T. as a freshman. He and his wife, Sally, have six children and five grandchildren and have made Minnesota their home since 1964.

We congratulate Joe Stoutenburgh on his election as our new President. The Executive Board looks forward to working with him in another exciting year for the Senior Tennis Players Club.
