

#### TENNIS, ANYONE?

Being a late starter, tennis at this stage of my life seemed like a good idea. Participating in the Senior Tennis Players Club practice drills seemed like a good place to begin and if by chance I succeeded in getting good, double' my pleasure. This could certainly 'serve' as the 'approach' to my becoming a high caliber 'court' champion. After three months of drills, I seemed to be falling behind my self-imposed time table and no title loomed 'overhead.'

Actually, I began to feel as if I would always be practicing. Would I ever get a chance to actually play? Would it always be practice, practice, practice? Would I ever get the hang of this 'racquet?' If this keeps up...I told myself...I'll soon be inducted into the Tennis Drill Hall of Fame.

Everyone tried very hard to remember what had been learned in our drills, but somehow it didn't seem quite the same. We were on our own, sometimes confused, but feeling

we had a chance to 'ace' this new game. No one felt out of place. Mistakes didn't matter, everyone was at or around the same ability level and we were playing. Criticisms were not 'lobbed' in anyone's direction.

There was a volunteer instructor on each court to give advice on rules, scoring, court positioning, proper tennis etiquette and answer any questions that might arise, with, you'll pardon the pun, no 'strings' attached.

Some of us tyros actually learned how to keep score. We also mastered the meaning of terms such as poaching and switching. Then came the deciphering of some hand signals that had been waved in our general direction. They actually had significance and they weren't even pornographic.

All of this and playing, too. Not quite a beginners' grand slam event, but close enough for us. You could even say the Senior Tennis Players Club scored four 'aces' in a row with their beginners playing sessions. Even some pros can't score that consistently!
