Join us for a pig roast Sunday, September 29, at Triangle Park in Rogers.



Register for the 1991-92 Indoor Playing Season

HOW AND WHEN DO I SIGN UP?

Permanent court time reservations are being accepted NOW for the indoor playing season which starts in September for some courts, October for others, and generally ends in April, 1992. Check the schedule in this SENIOR TENNIS TIMES, select the location, day and time that suits you best, then call the captain to sign up. Permanent court time is a commitment to play for that period EVERY WEEK.

WHAT IS THE COST?

The cost for permanent court time varies by location, but averages \$5 per member for two hours, which is 40%-50% less than the usual cost. And without the hundreds of dollars in membership fees.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I TAKE A VACATION OR A TRIP OUT OF TOWN OR IF I HAVE AN EMERGENCY AND CAN'T KEEP MY COMMITMENT?

Players with permanent court time <u>must</u> be prepared to provide a substitute if they can't play during their committed time. When you line up a substitute, be sure it is understood that if they don't show, <u>you</u> are responsible for payment of the court fee, and <u>you</u> face the disappointed players who counted on that fourth person for doubles.

WHAT IF I'M NOT INTERESTED IN A WEEKLY COMMITMENT, BUT WOULD LIKE TO PLAY NOW AND THEN?

Call the court captain NOW and sign up as a substitute. Substitute lists (and they're important) are furnished regular players by the captain, substitutes are in demand, and it's likely you will be called.

I STILL HAVE QUESTIONS. WHO ANSWERS THEM?

Court captains can give you details on starting dates, fees, rotation of playing, etc. Just remember, all captains may not operate the same.

I'M NEW IN THE CLUB AND WAS TOLD I'M ENTITLED TO FREE LESSONS. TRUE?

Yes! An important objective of the club is to encourage more people over 50 to learn tennis. New members are entitled to 12 free sessions of tennis instruction. Yes, 12 free sessions.

WHERE ARE THESE SESSIONS HELD?

A schedule of lessons and drills is listed in this SENIOR TENNIS TIMES. You don't have to register or commit to an entire season-just pack your racquet and show up. Balls are provided. If you have questions, call the instructor listed—the instructor will be glad to talk with you.

Stress...

Ease up on your self-expectations. You don't have to be "everything to everybody." You don't have to be perfect at everything you do. Be kind to yourself. Talk to yourself as if you were your best friend instead of a cruel critic.

Twelve Unwritten Rules of Good Courtmanship

The first four Unwritten Rules of Good Courtmanship were published in the July and August SENIOR TENNIS TIMES. To continue--

5) AVOID STALLING

While it is hardly necessary to sprint around the court retrieving balls for the server, it is not considered good form to be a "creeper" either. You should get back into position for receiving the next serve as soon as possible after a point is completed.

6) CALLING SERVES

In lieu of an umpire, it falls upon the receiver of the service to plainly call close serves, whether good or out. And in the case of doubt it is, of course, good tennis manners to give your opponent the benefit of the call. Strictly speaking, the receiver should not touch any service which does not fall good. In case of any misunderstood call, or any circumstance outside of normal play which throws the server off his or her balance, it is customary for the receiver to offer replay of the point. Also, offer to replay the point if during a rally there is interference caused by ball rolling on your court.

REPLAY OF FAST SERVICE

Before delivering the service, it is the responsibility of the server to be sure the receiver is ready and to offer replay of the service if any doubt exists. When receiving, do not return the ball unless the serve was good and you intended to play the point.

CROSSING COURTS

When one of your balls wanders over into an adjoining court where play is in progress, never attempt to retrieve it during play. Wait until the point is completed; then retrieve the ball quickly or if it's convenient to a player on the other court, ask for it with a polite "thank you." In the same regard, if a ball from another court turns up on yours, it is proper for you to return it at the first break in your own play.


