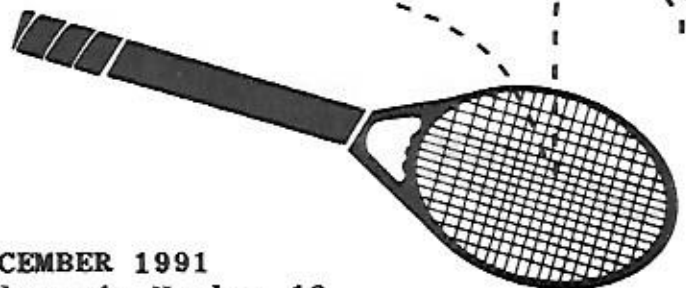
## FACILITIES: WHAT'S HAPPENING by Bob Western

# TENNIS TIPS by Ernie Greene, USPTA, USPTR

## GET MORE POWER IN YOUR SERVE

Problem: Failure to rotate the shoulders! Too many club players serve with shoulders square to the net. That means the burden of putting power behind the ball falls entirely on the arm and wrist. And it's impossible, Stan Smith says, to generate any real speed that way.

Solution: To get that speed you should rotate your shoulders smoothly as you move your racquet up to meet the ball. It's not hard to

develop that shoulder rotation-- if you remember one thing. Keep your front arm pointing up in the air a little longer after your ball toss.

That way, your shoulders will be roughly at right angles to the net as you start bringing your racquet up. And you'll have to rotate your shoulders forward in order to hit the ball. That simple action will give you the power you want.

## Mrs. Minnesota and Mother-of-the-Year Nets Charm and Enthusiasm with STPC Performances



Don't be misled into thinking most Norwegians revere only lefse and lutefisk. There just happens to be an Edina blonde bombshell adored and respected by many who can light up all of Minnesota and Scandinavia with her dazzling smile and sparkling personality--and that's just for starters.

Mary Johnson, 61, radiates a fairy tale aura that Hans Christian Andersen (yipes, he's a Dane) couldn't do justice to in storied fantasy. We are dealing here, fellow tennis buffs, with a phenomenon that puts Halley's comet and the Taj Mahal to shame. It follows that if Edvard Grieg, the noted Norwegian composer, were alive today, most likely he'd dedicate a special symphony to our profile subject named "Opus Mary, No. 1."

Co-owner of the highly successful Scandia Imports in downtown Minneapolis with husband, Jim, Mary is a walking and talking saga of lifelong success whatever her determinations. You just don't get to be Mrs. Minnesota in 1982 and Minnesota's Mother-of-the-Year in 1984 without demonstrating ability beyond reach of the ordinary, which suggests you're dealing with an extraordinary Norse.

Wouldn't you just know Mary was born in

Oslo, Norway, to parents engaged in the textile importing business? She attended business school and somehow met Jim Johnson, a handsome U. S. Navy sailor, on shore leave. They had just one date that ended in a kiss followed by four years of correspondence. From then on it was a proposal and marriage in Oslo. The happy conclusion had Jim rather than a fjord in her future! Moving to New York City, Mary worked at Abraham & Strauss as a salesperson in the sportswear department. From there she and Jim moved to Florida where they raised their two daughters and a son.

While on an extended vacation to Scandinavia in 1965, Jim decided to go into business for himself. He bought merchandise to open the first Scandia Imports store on 28th and Hennepin in 1966. Later the store located in LaSalle Court, and after a 14-year stay moved to the present City Center premises. Both Mary and Jim staffed the store which has always been based on the concept of handling everything Scandinavian except furniture.

Before going on to the real meaty part of Mary's amazing career, an aside of how she became interested in the STPC. Elsebeth Kozar introduced her to STPC people in 1988 along with a heady 3.5 rating. She cites the "wonderful, gentle and courteous participants" she has met in the seniors group. Summer finds Mary playing at Wolfe and Lone Parks plus membership in the Northwest Racquet Club.

There's quite a story of how Mary became not only a successful business woman but a devoted homemaker, loving wife and mother and untiring civic leader as well. A list of her communal activities include work with the Sons of Norway, American Swedish Institute, Norwegian-American Chamber of Commerce Ladies Auxiliary Board, Kidney Foundation Auxiliary, Norwegian-American Museum fund-raising, Norsemen's Federation, Vinland National Health Sports Center for the Handicapped, U of M

Mother's Club for sororities, National Exchange Program for Norwegian Home Guard as hostess president, Minnesota Syttende Mai, Nordic Center Board, Christian Women's Club, Edina Woman's Club and many others.

Surprised when she won Mrs. Minnesota at the '82 annual state pageant, Mary was shocked a few years later to garner Mother-of-the-Year honors. In both contests she was highly recommended by people who had worked closely with her in various organizations. As husband Jim quoted for publication several years ago, "Mary is a model homemaker, immaculate housekeeper, avid baker and the most organized person I have ever known." She has been described in glowing terms by people of all persuasions as charming, graceful, intelligent, poised, sense of humor, thoughtful, a woman of integrity and loyal.

In a Skyway News fashion article several years back, Mary was quoted as follows: "It's always good to build a wardrobe around three or four complementary colors. Remember, too, quality in clothing will always be the best choice and pay you back many times over the initial cost." In interviewing Mary at her home recently, she was dressed in impeccable taste.

Following the interview, the Johnsons took me on a tour of their lovely home. The upstairs rooms were lined with the most interesting art objects--museum quality with Scandinavian overtones. Each item seemed to fit perfectly in its niche, and I was boggled by the enormity of the various collections. The downstairs rooms were lined with hundreds of pictures of family and various national and international personages. I'm talking about kings and other important personalities here, gang, and to say the least I was most impressed. I noticed that both Mary and Jim had received the Norwegian Home Guard Medal of Honor and Jim the St. Olaf medal, also.

In studying some of the material Mary showed me regarding her career, I couldn't help but think this was an unusually unique woman. I was particularly interested in a response she had written after winning one of her numerous lifetime awards. The title: Take Time. Here in part are some of the highlights:

Take time to THINK,  
It is the source of power.

Take time to PLAY,  
It is the secret of perpetual youth.

Take time to READ,  
It is the fountain of wisdom.

Take time to LOVE AND BE LOVED,  
It is a God-given privilege.

Take time to be FRIENDLY,  
It is the road to happiness.

Take time to LAUGH.  
It is the music of the soul.

Take time to DO CHARITY.  
It is the key to heaven.

All of Mary's activities have been without self-serving motives and what she has given has been with sincerity and love for mankind. Her life can be made into a novel because of her completeness in all forms of endeavor, and she has that delicious sense of humor with the warmth of what we term a "toucher." Now lest you Swedes and Danes feel I have written an inordinate amount of copy about the Norwegians, let me assure you Mary's Jim is Swedish. In subsequent profiles you might have to lend me a Dane!

How does one conclude a too brief profile about Mary Johnson? I can only echo the words of William Shakespeare as related by Hamlet (and incidentally is my phone-answering machine message): "Brevity is the soul of wit." Mary, you're a oner!

### ED SILBERMAN HONORED

Professor Edward Silberman of Golden Valley, former director of the University of Minnesota's St. Anthony Falls Hydraulic Laboratory, has been elected an Honorary Member of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) by the society's board of directors.

Silberman was cited for his eminence as a researcher in hydraulics, water resources management and naval hydrodynamics, his dedication to engineering education, and his contributions to national and local professional societies. His work with St. Anthony Falls began in the 1940s.

Silberman represents the city of Golden Valley as a citizen commissioner on the Bassett Creek Water Management Commission.

He has BA and MA degrees in civil engineering from the University of Minnesota. The ASCE award he received is considered one of the highest forms of civil engineering peer recognition; only one out of every 7,500 ASCE members is given the honor.

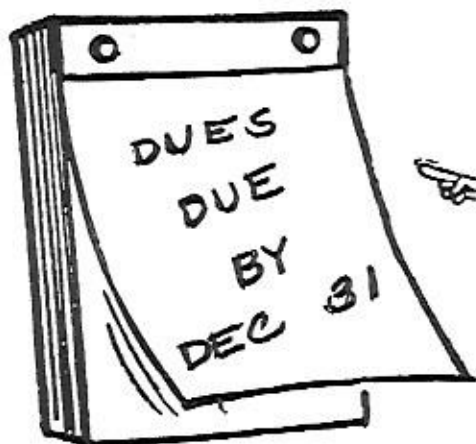
