I was able to attend the recent meeting of the Activities Committee, ably chaired by Sue Larson. Detailed plans are being worked out for the social and tennis/social activities for the year. If more members could witness and appreciate the amount of time and care devoted to the development of these activities, I am certain that attendance would be enhanced considerably. The history of the events in the past has shown, it seems to me, the degree of careful consideration and attention to detail that event chair persons and other committee members have consistently put into our excellent activities program. I encourage all members to maximize their membership benefits by taking advantage of these events in the coming year. Details will be forthcoming in this and later newsletters.

In line with comments about the Activities Committee, I must announce the resignation of Frank McCabe as a Director of the Board, effective October 1, 1994. Frank has been a strong board member with reliable attendance at our meetings. He very capably chaired the Tennis Party activities for the past year or so and his strong direction will be missed. He is moving to Florida but will be around here 5 months of the year, so we will still be able to play tennis with him and his wife during the summer. Thanks for your conscientious support, Frank.

For you statistics buffs, I have just finished a comparative analysis of a couple of the demographics for our members — '94 with '95. Based on your self-ratings, it appears as if our club's skill level has increased over the past year. In the 1993 analysis (reported in the October '93 issue of the *Times*), 44.35% reported skill ratings of 3.0 or above. In the '94 analysis, 49.48% reported skill ratings of 3.0 or above. This probably reflects the addition of more skilled members as well as member judgments of improvement in their play. I prefer to accept the latter explanation as evidence of successful achievement of one of our goals.

The second analysis indicates that the largest increases in members this year came from zip code areas representing the Shorewood, Excelsior, Burnsville, and Richfield areas (increases of 7 to 13 members in each). Decreases were experienced in zip code areas representing the St. Anthony, Lake Nokomis, Glen Lake, and Roseville areas (decreases of 6 to 9 members in each). These figures are based on a total membership of 1346 for 1993 and 1314 for 1994, as of July.

As fall approaches, I am looking ahead to projects or possible concerns that might provide agenda items for the Board of Directors. I am thinking of establishing a task force (that we might call STPC 2000) which would be given the charge of determining what our club should look like at the turn of the century. Should we continue to try to attract new members, to become bigger and bigger, or should we put a cap on membership size? What changes should we make in our structure, our activities, our purposes? How can we improve our administrative organization? Can we improve the benefits to be derived from club membership? I will propose such a task force at the Board's next meeting on September 8. I would hope to include non-Board members on such a task force. If you would be interested in serving on such a task force, please drop me a line or give me a phone call at 644-8304.

Tennis Tips

- Are you having trouble returning a fast hard-hit serve? You could back up so you have more time to react, or shorten your back swing and take the ball on the rise (like a half-volley), or use a slice return. Hitting a ball on the rise (which would be similar to a ballplayer fielding a grounder) gives a moment of surprise to the opponent and not as much time to respond.
- "Let's play first ball in." In social tennis, if this is agreeable to those playing, it's acceptable. If you want to play "no add" and it's okay with everybody, it's acceptable. However, in a sanctioned tournament when you are required to be a member of the USTA, it is not acceptable.
- When you hear of a "10- or 8 game pro set", that's whatever the pro decides to make it.
- Correcting a "windshield wiper" backhand stroke (hitting the forehand and backhand on the same side of the racquet, usually not changing to a backhand grip): When returning a forchard, aim palm and forefingers towards the target. When returning a backhand, at the moment of contact, aim knuckles and rings on your fingers towards the target.
- Something to keep in mind when playing. This thought was submitted by a reader: "In playing doubles, we're out there to have fun and to get exercise, not to compete. All too often the name of the game is to win, the net result being that a very high percentage of the balls are hit to the weaker player, thus depriving stronger partners of their share of the fun and exercise."

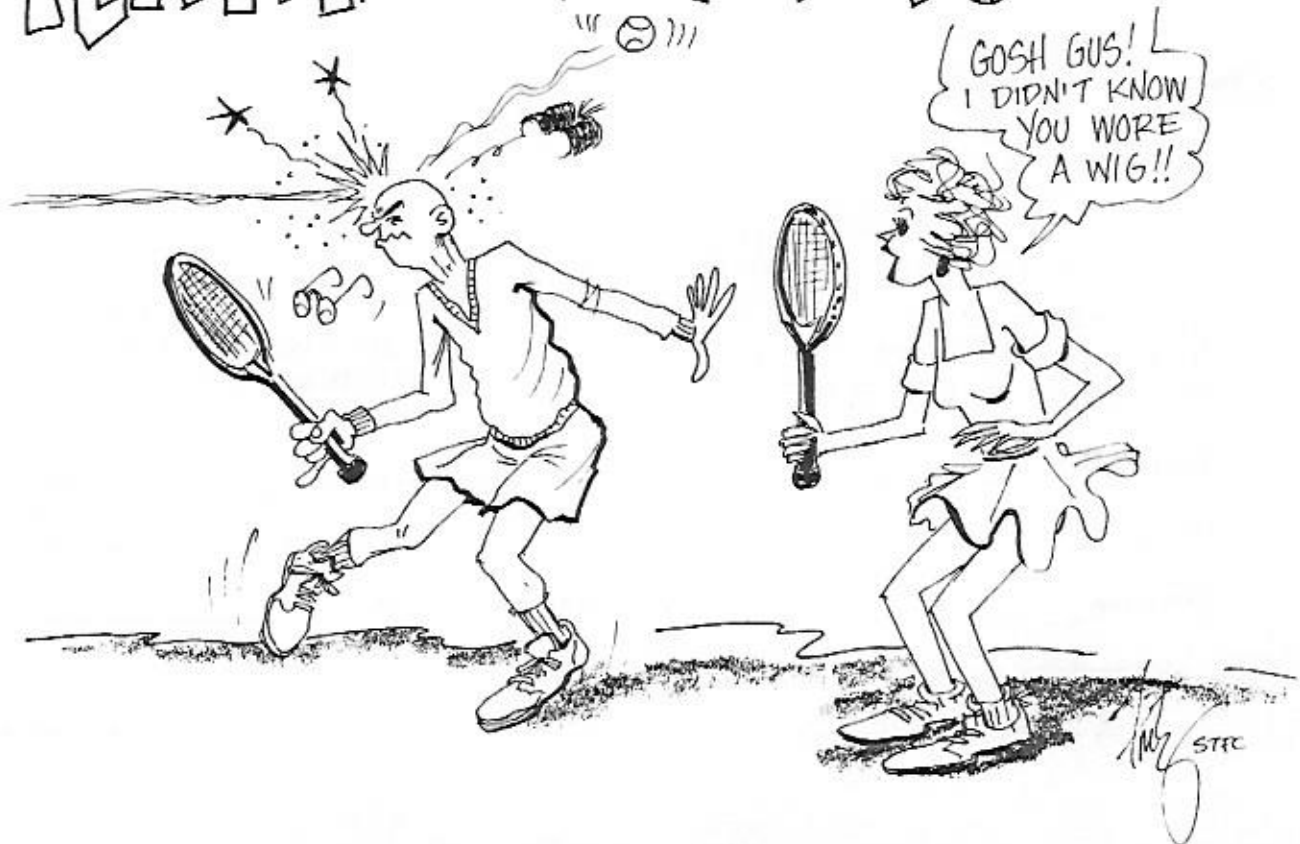

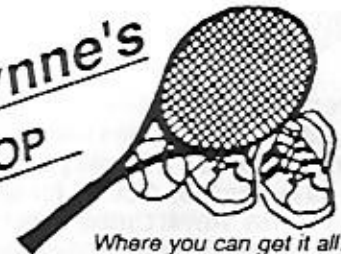


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
