CAPTAINS' CORNER by Chuck Slocum, Facilities/Programs Director

INDOOR SEASON STARTS—KEEP COOL, HAVE FUN!

The indoor season is in full swing. We still have places to play if you are willing to get up in the morning. Captains, please review your rosters and make sure your players are bona fide members of STPC. This is vital because of liability problems. You are responsible for unauthorized players being on court. If you need application blanks, call me.

Please permit me to remind you that when you are playing and things aren't going your way, don't get mad—take a Composure Break. From Vision Tennis by Michael Zosel, here is a 4-step procedure you can use when you are nervous or upset:

1. Go to your towel at sidecourt. Towel off.

2. Take a "belly breath." Inhale a deep breath of air through your nostrils and expand your stomach like a balloon. (Note: Unfortunately, some of us have stomachs already expanded!)
3. Confidence Chant. Think positive affirmations.
4. Bounce on your toes. Get "happy feet."
5. You can do this within a 20-25 second timeframe and by so doing, you will significantly improve your odds of winning the next point. So don't get mad—take a Composure Break! ■

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Captains' Profiles

LOIS AND PAUL LOKENSgard

Lois hails from North Dakota; Paul's a Minneapolis boy. Lois started tennis at fifty, learning with her youngest daughter; Paul began at age thirteen, playing on and off ever since. Lois left the Dakotas to attend Minnesota's St. Olaf College; Paul left Minnesota to party with the folks at Kwajalein, Saipan, Tinian and Iwo Jima, where he earned the name of "Lucky Lokie" admitting that, "I shouldn't even be alive."

About the time that Paul returned to Minnesota to study business at the U, Lois was working on her nursing degree at Fairview School of Nursing. In 1948, chance brought them together at a wedding where Lois was a bridesmaid. Tradition would dictate that bells rang, whistles and sirens sounded and fireworks shot skyward when they met. Love Stories

STEADY EDDIE RACQUET READY

He has two artificial shoulders and two metallic hips. He still plays aggressive tennis seven days a week during Minnesota's sunshine season. This is not a story about the Bionic Man but of a wired-up achiever, Edward "Steady Eddie" Silberman, 82, an unleashed whirlwind who always keeps looking ahead to the next court challenge. He has mellowed in the past several years but readily admits to being a popoff when opponents didn't play strictly by the rules.

The Silberman family hailed from Streefer, North Dakota, where Eddie was only a gleam in his father's eyes. He was actually born in Minneapolis where he attended North High. It was then on to the University of Minnesota where he got a BA with high distinction in Civil Engineering. In the following year he attained his Masters in Civil Engineering and his amazing career was on the way. To digress, in 1991 he was elected an Honorary Member of the American Society of Civil Engineers in recognition of his many contributions to the field.

Silberman started work on his doctorate at the University of Tennessee but was waylaid by accepting a position with TVA (Tennessee Valley Authority). World War II intervened and in 1941 he began a five-year hitch with the US Corps of Engineers, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. Before entering the service, he traveled Minnesota for the State

Planning Board's Water Resources group; was a civilian engineer in Red Wing for the Lock and Dam No. 3 project; worked in Kansas City for the Minneapolis Dredging Co.; and traveled extensively for the CAA working on drainage systems for landing fields.

In October, 1941, he married his sweetheart, Idell, not realizing she would become super active in many worthwhile organizations through now and their 55th wedding anniversary hiatus.

It was 1946 when he launched his educational career by becoming a research associate at the University of Minnesota. Advancing to the title of Assistant Professor, Silberman taught classes in fluid mechanics (whatever that means). He then went up to Associate Professor and in 1957 became a full Professor. He formally retired from the U of M in December 1981, but continued to teach in water resources management as an Adjunct Professor until 1986. He still performs research at the St. Anthony Falls Hydraulic Laboratory.

A lecturer on topics related to water management, Silberman also serves as a consultant and expert witness on hydraulic engineering and fluid mechanics problems. He represents Golden Valley on the Bassett Creek Water Management Commission. Too numerous to mention are the many honors he has accrued in his brilliant career but a few are noteworthy to list: Distinguished Education Award in 1975 from Polytechnic Institute of New York; NATO Senior

Fellow, Delft Hydraulics Laboratory, The Netherlands, 1967; and Sloan Foundation Grant 1974-75, "Extending the Social Dimensions of Engineering Education."

Although not a current hobby, Silberman was once a Scoutmaster and took his troops on camp out trips to test water resources. But today he focuses on tennis and recalls how Jack Dow enlisted him in the STPC from the Minneapolis Tennis Club located at the Parade Grounds by Walker Art Center. It follows that Silberman has always felt he's been in the right place at the right time and cites that as his philosophy of life. He's not interested in changing the world but hopes the world would change itself for the better.

"In politics parties are important," Silberman says, "but politicians should once and for all set down an agenda with specific plans. Too often they vacillate and blow changes in the wind to suit the current event." He thinks that welfare is out of hand and that the new welfare reform bill should be modified.

Silberman was always athletically inclined and is proud of the fact he was a sub for Biggie Munn at North High. Munn became a legendary U of M player and national pigskin hero. Silberman admits to being a bully in his younger days but now is mellow on the courts. With wife Idell, the Silbermans have four children, one great grandchild along with three regular grandchildren and several grand canines. Despite his bionic state, Silberman's health is excellent and he'll play until he has to resort solely to drop shots.

Steady Eddie—what a human dynamo! ■
