- Playing of doubles is organized all year round.

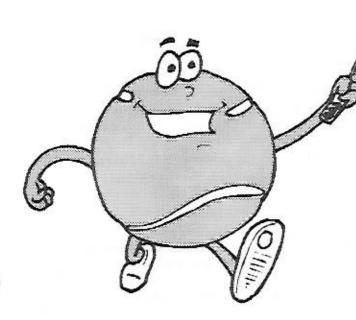

The Tie Break Game

The team that first wins seven points shall win the game provided it leads by a margin of two points. If the score reaches six points all, the game shall be extended until this margin has been achieved. The player whose turn it is to serve shall be the server for the first point. Their opponent shall be the server for the second and third points and thereafter each player serves alternately for two consecutive points until the winner of the game and set has been decided.

From the first point, each service shall be delivered alternately from the right and left court, beginning with the right court. If service from a wrong half of the court occurs and is undetected, all playing resulting from such wrong service or services shall stand, but the inaccuracy of station shall be corrected immediately when discovered.

Players shall change ends after every six points and at the conclusion of the tie break game.

Captain's Profile

By Carol Hall—Senior Tennis Camp without Chuck Supplee would be like Heaven without Saint Peter!

Chuck's been welcoming campers at the "pearly gates" of their dormitory ever since he got the first tennis camp up and running some twelve years ago. Chuck eventually took over the popular summer event from STPC, and now manages it on his own.

"Every year a lot of people come to the University campus at River Falls, Wisconsin, where we hold the camp and they usually improve their game," Chuck

said. "And the price is right, more reasonable than other tennis camps, so more people can afford it."

Senior Tennis Camp is only one of Chuck's significant contributions to STPC. Easily a candidate for the Jack Dow trophy, his past credits include Board of Directors service, originating the first annual meeting, recruiting some 200 new members, and procuring the Decathlon and Northland facilities. Very

early on, Chuck even presided over a separate Bloomington chapter of STPC. Today he is Decathlon facility coordinator and captains there winters, and at Dred Scott, summers.

Today, Chuck jokes, he is also "homeless, worthless, and jobless." Actually, he's between homes. His new Bloomington co-op condominium should be completed in three months. Meanwhile, Chuck and wife Shirley can be reached at 947-9451.

"Worthless," never! Chuck is unfailingly humble and gracious, qualities evincing his deep Christian faith. During the 1960s and 1970s, Chuck served as an unpaid volunteer for Lay Witness Mission, a national evangelism organization. He gave his weekends over to traveling to neighboring states to preach evangelism.

"Jobless," only during vacation from his security position at Seagate Warehouse in Edina. Although 79, Chuck continues to work even after retiring in 1984 from a career as a printer.

"Printing was the seventh biggest industry in Minnesota fifty years ago," Chuck said. "Then Minneapolis had three newspapers and a shopping guide." Chuck worked for Lund Press, the Minneapolis Star and Augsburg Publishing. He was trained at Dunwoody Institute as a linotype operator.

To know Chuck is to discover his ancestry. He's traced it back to pre-Revolutionary War times. The French Supplees settled in Pennsylvania, his mother's English people, North Carolina. It seems that an early Supplee was the first sheriff in Pennsylvania. And according to Chuck, odd family coincidences abound. His son Joe, for example, named his children Nathan and Rebecca, without knowing that these were common family names 125 years ago.

Chuck and seven siblings were born in Mediapolis, Iowa. Their paint salesman father moved the family from Mediapolis to Minneapolis, where Chuck graduated from Washburn High School.

He served with the Army Quartermasters Corps in Hawaii during World War II.

Chuck is very close to Shirley and his family. "We've been married over fifty years and she's only 49," he joked. They are presently living with daughter Eileen, who "invited us." Son Paul is "the number one pastry chef in the US," according to Chuck. Son Joe lives on thirty-six country acres near River Falls, Wisconsin. There are six grandchildren and one great grandchild, who Chuck says "came with a bunch of hair!"

Chuck's tennis camp staff surprised him at the July session with the gift of a sports watch. "I was thrilled, I relished getting it," Chuck said.

Already preparing for 1999, Chuck plans to add an extra session for 3.0 and 3.5 players only. And anyone signing up early will pay less for the camp.

Ask Chuck why he ever got involved in the considerable task of running the Senior Tennis Camp and he'll tell you he did it to improve his own game.

And indeed he did. So well did Chuck play at the recent Duluth Northland Senior Games, he won big, and is headed for Orlando, Florida in 1999 for the Senior Olympics Nations, just as he did to Syracuse in 1991.
