Reed-Sweatt Family Tennis Center Dedication and Tribute to Lach Reed

A new chapter in the history of Nicollet Tennis Center was written on May 19, 2002. The newly renovated facility was renamed and dedicated The Reed-Sweatt Family Tennis Center, in honor of InnerCity Tennis founder Lach Reed and the years of support of the Sweatt family. As a gathering of close friends and members of the Reed and Sweatt clans looked on, Dr. Peter Benson, President of ICT, honored Lach Reed and the Sweatt family by unveiling a sign near the entrance of the facility which bears its new name and logo.

Afterwards, family and friends gathered at the Lafayette Club on Lake Minnetonka for a dinner and presentation celebrating the life and career of InnerCity Tennis founder Lach Reed. Over 150 guests were in attendance at the event hosted by Wheelock Whitney, local business mogul, philanthropist and longtime friend of Lach and ICT.

Attendees listened to speeches by Howard Reed, Each's brother, retired professor of Middle Eastern history and decorated naval veteran; Hal Scott, friend and Yale classmate; Hal Haskell, friend and co-administrator in the Eisenhower administration; George Pillsbury, neighbor, former state senator and political activist; Gerrit Keator, retired president of International College in Beirut, founded by Lach's grandfather; Lach Reed II, son and former educator at International College in Beirut and St. Alban's in Washington DC; Ian Reed, son and owner of Zen Zen Garden Home Company in California; and Roger Boyer, Executive Director of InnerCity Tennis who has worked closely with Lach for the last nine years.

Over 250 adults and children turned out for the event that raised \$3500 for the ICT endowment. The day featured a silent auction, clinics for adults and kids led by Nick, entertainment by the Percy Hughes Trio, and opportunities for those in attendance to hear Bollettieri's tips for better play and ideas on how tennis can be used to teach valuable life lessons to the young people involved.

Nick showcased his new "Tennis In a Can" program for high school tennis coaches and sent more than a few in attendance home with great prizes. One lucky winner, Jean Murdock, current president of the Senior Tennis Players Club, walked away with an all-expenses-paid week at the Bollettieri Tennis Academy in Bradenton, Florida. Other attendees received tennis racquets and autographed copies of various Bollettieri books.

Nick not only donated his time and talent to InnerCity Tennis, but he also praised and endorsed the work of the organization and the dedication of ICT Executive Director Roger Boyer and his staff and volunteers. He solidified that endorsement by promising to come back every year for the event. And Nick has already asked to come back in October to host a day of clinics for seniors and a "Tennis In a Can" seminar for high school tennis coaches in Minnesota; the event is scheduled for Saturday, October 26, 2002.

With any luck Nick Bollettieri will be coming back to InnerCity Tennis for many years to come and will always find himself welcome for his ideas, skills and support for the kids involved in ICT programs.

Be Safe in the Sun

During our brief Minnesota summer, most of us enjoy spending time outdoors. As you plan your activities, it's important to stay safe and limit the amount of time you spend in the sun.

"Most people are eager to get out in the sunshine after a long winter," said Barry Baines, M.D., Medicare Medical Director for UCare Minnesota, which offers several health plans for Medicare-eligible adults. "However, getting too much sun can lead to sunstroke or skin cancer. As we age, our skin also becomes more sensitive to the sun."

Here are a few simple ways you can enjoy the sun safely:

- Be a shade dweller. Stay in the shade as much as possible, especially between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. If you are in the sun, be sure to wear protective clothing, such as a hat and sunglasses. And don't forget the sunscreen choose one with a sun protection factor (SPF) that fits your sensitivity.
- Drink plenty of water. The sun increases water loss, which can lead to dehydration.

- Don't overdo it. If you exercise or work outside, do so with caution or out of the direct sun.
- Ask your doctor if you are on any medications that make you more sensitive. Certain medicines make you more sensitive to the sun's rays. You may need to step up your sun protection.

So, if you're spending time out in the garden or just taking a walk, make sure you are properly protected.
